The following criteria will be used to determine if a purchase is Green/Sustainable. Purchased material certified by Green Seal, Energy Star, EcoLogo, Watersense, or other recognized independent third-party (see attached list). □ New City buildings and other projects constructed to LEED Gold standard or better. Remodel projects constructed to LEED Gold standard or better. Net Zero or Net Zero Ready projects (and/or the facilitation thereof). Construction, Deconstruction or Demolition Waste Diversion that conforms to The City Operation Services Building Design and Construction Standards. ☐ Computers: Personal Computers, Laptops, and Monitors meeting EPEAT Gold rating. Vehicles: New vehicles which utilize alternative fuels including: Electric **CNG** LNG _ Propane _ Hybrid Other Alternative Fueled 25% Improvement in City MPG vs Vehicle it is replacing ☐ Paper: Paper with at least 30% post-consumer recycled content, totally chlorine-free and process chlorine free recycled paper. Also, paper which is FSC certified. ☐ Printing Jobs: Printing jobs meeting any of the following criteria: Uses paper that is Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) certified Uncoated paper: Minimum of 30% post-consumer recycled content Coated paper: Minimum of 10% post-consumer recycled content Use soy or vegetable-based inks; preferably with low Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) of less than 3% FSC-certified printer Purchases that achieve a Green/Sustainable outcome for the City. Purchases that promote Bicycle Transportation, other modes of alternative transportation, and Public mass transit. Purchases of Goods and/or Services awarded from Bids and RFPs where sustainability criteria is part of the specifications. Purchases that provide Environmental Restoration, Revegetation or other activities that rejuvenate a distressed natural resource.

The Director of Purchasing may at his discretion designate a purchase to be considered a

Green/Sustainable Purchase.
